

CHARACTER ED - LESSON OUTLINE

Thank you for volunteering to teach PSE's monthly character traits!

We appreciate your commitment to support our character education initiative at PSE. By working together, we can build strong character in our children that will last a lifetime.

Each month, we highlight a specific trait elected by the PSE Character Board.

You will be responsible for teaching a monthly 30 to 45 minute lesson which will be held in your student's classroom.

New this year: When you arrive to volunteer, please remember to sign in on the sheet located on the Character Education bookshelf in the media center (right side wall when you enter the media center).

Prior to the lesson day:

1. The Google Slide Presentation and activity or worksheet is posted online on our PSE Character Education Webpage.

2. The lessons will be held in the classroom. This year we will be using SignUp Genius for scheduling; they will be sent out monthly. Teachers will provide several days/times that work for the class and you will choose the day/time that is most convenient for you. If there isn't a time that works for your or your partner's schedule, please let Christy know ASAP. You may choose to alternate teaching with your CE partner or you both may choose to teach together. That is up to you!

3. If your monthly lesson involves a book (K-2nd), please visit the Character Education bookshelf located in the Media Center prior to your lesson to check out your book. Please remember to return the book at the end of your lesson!

Structure of classroom presentations:

1. Google Slides Presentation & Group Discussion

- Introduce yourself to the class
- Introduce this month's character trait and see if the students have an idea what it means.

- Start going through the slide presentation. Each click of the mouse should move you through the presentation – either bringing up new text/images or moving you to the next page.
- The slide presentation is a basis for your discussion. Your goal is to try and keep the presentation interesting, engaging and dynamic. The text on the slides should be part of a discussion with the class – not just read out loud page after page.
- If the younger grades start to get fidgety, you can stop the lesson at any point and switch to the book. After the book you can return to the slides or move on to the activity.

2. Book (For Kinder through 2nd grade)

- Books will be available on the Character Education bookshelf for grades K-2. If you have time to incorporate a book into your lesson, feel free to read the book to the class and briefly have a dialogue about the character trait highlighted for the month.

3. Activity

- Try to save time at the end of the presentation for the activity.
- If you run out of time, please pass the activity on to the teacher to do with the class on another date.
- Sometimes a passionate discussion with the class will be prompted by the slides. Don't worry if this happens and you don't have time to finish the slides. The discussion may end up being the best thing to help them understand the character trait!

Important guidelines:

People have different religious and political beliefs and as volunteers in the classroom, we need to be sensitive to this. Please focus on teaching the trait of the month without incorporating any religious or political references into your lesson plans or activities.

Please respect PSE's "no sibling" policy. Do not bring siblings into the classroom to observe.

If you have your own video or book that you'd like to bring to share with the class, please approve it through Christy first.

- Videos will need to be approved through the school or they might be blocked by the CMS Firewall.
- Books need to be checked to make sure they aren't being used for an upcoming class seminar.

After the lesson is completed, **please email (via Fresh Schools) the parents** a short summary of what you did so they can further explore that character trait at home.

If for some reason you are unable to teach a lesson, please contact Christy Masri ASAP so she can find a replacement volunteer.
