Our faculty recently participated in a seminar, "The Students are Watching," by The Sizers. This discussion led to self-reflection of our moral contract to all constituencies. Discussions included the importance of modeling behaviors, the impact of relationships, and growth mindset. We know our brains are malleable; we can make our brains "stronger" or "weaker." At PSE, our staff strive daily to model behaviors and to teach lessons that make our little people better humans. As a mommy, I know that it takes a village to raise my own children and my PSE children. I recently read an article titled, "Why are kids impatient, bored, friendless, and entitled?" Despite all our great intentions, we unfortunately

remold our children's brains in the wrong direction. I wanted to highlight a few reasons that remind me that our children are watching us every single day.

1. Kids get everything they want when they want it

Delayed gratification is one of the key factors for future success. We have the best intention to make them happy for the moment, but in the long term, they will be unable to cope with minor stressors and obstacles in life. The inability to delay gratification can be seen in the classrooms because the moment they hear, "no," the child may become belligerent.

What can we do? Train delayed gratification.

2. Limited unstructured natural environment

Technology has replaced outdoor time. Often children are too busy in structured activities, so they have limited opportunities to practice and learn social skills. PSE believes in learning through our four pillars; our focus this year is on the Paideia philosophy and character education. If we want our children to learn social norms, they must practice, practice, and practice. The most successful people have great social skills.

What can we do? Limit technology. Reconnect with your child emotionally. Go outdoors.

3. Always ON

We schedule our lives and our children's lives with so much activity there are no dull moments. The moment that it becomes quiet, we entertain them again. It's often we hear children say, "I'm bored" or "I can't" when asking them to fold laundry, unload the dishwasher, and clean up. It's this basic, monotonous work that trains our brains to be workable and function under "boredom." Similarly, it's this same "muscle" that is required to be teachable at school.

What can we do? Teach your child to do monotonous work (unpack groceries/lunchboxes, chores). This is what creates a teachable child.

It is our job to set the stage for their success. Providing opportunities to set high standards of behaviors and high academic achievement will create children who become productive citizens of a world very different than the one we know.


