Make the Most of Your PSE PTA Donation

In the 2017-2018 school year, the PSE PTA received almost \$120,000 in donations during the Rocket Fuel campaign (Boosterthon) and through capital donations and matching programs. WOW! The amazing generosity of our families helped us to purchase many needed items for the school which have enhanced the learning experiences of your children, as well as the desired shade for our playgrounds.

While we will not be participating in Boosterthon for the 2018-2019 school year, PSE still needs your support to continue to fund the growing needs of our school, as well as purchase educational materials and technology. Please consider making a tax-exempt donation to the PSE PTA to continue to fund these needs.

Many corporations offer corporate matching programs that will match employee donations to qualifying nonprofit organizations, such as our PTA. These donations largely go untapped, when they are easy to access. Almost 65% of Fortune 500 companies offer this program, and the PSE PTA has received matches from companies such as Bank of America, Wells Fargo, Duke Energy and TIAA-CREF in the past, to name a few. The process is simple. If you have made a donation to the PSE PTA, check your employer's Human Resources department to see if they offer gift matching. If your employer does offer gift matching, your HR department should provide you with a matching gift form to complete online or to give to PSE PTA. Some companies even provide payroll deduction services which they match dollar for dollar.

Your company may require proof of PSE PTA's tax deductible status. We are part of a tax exempt group, North Carolina Congress of Parents and Teachers, Inc., and can forward a copy of our 501(c)(3) letter to your employer if they require it.
